A warm welcome back to St Francis Xavier to all of our school community. I hope you have had a lovely time with family and friends over Christmas. A special welcome to all of our new families who join us this term. We know you will have an enriching and supportive experience at St Francis Xavier Catholic School.

This year we welcome Miss Lisa Boessenkool to our school as she embarks on her teaching journey. Lisa has a passion for music and working with young people and is very excited to be working at St Francis Xavier Catholic School.

Our teaching staff have been busy preparing classrooms and learning programmes for their students. Our support staff have all been busy preparing resources and organising our school systems for the start of the new year. Our whole staff attended a Staff Hui on Creating a Culture of Care and Wellbeing on the 28th of January. The programme will include a combination of sports, religious education, music, enviro and art that is designed to be delivered in ways to strengthen tuakana teina practice. This is a new initiative and it will enable the pooling of teacher talents to support whanau teams across the school. We will keep you posted as to how it is all going.

You may have noticed that our Holy Family statue has arrived and is now placed in a central point in our school. This has been a team effort to source, finance, transport and position the Holy Family statue and landscape the garden for it. We know this will be a great focus for families and visitors now and in the future, and a reminder that we are a proudly Catholic school. The last Ordinary Jubilee was the Great Jubilee of 2000, celebrated by Pope John Paul II.

Ash Wednesday

We will be celebrating Ash Wednesday with a Mass, on **Wednesday 5th March** at **9:00 am** in the church. We look forward to seeing you there.

Why do we place cold ashes on our foreheads?

Ash Wednesday begins Lent, a time when we stop and assess how we're doing in our walk with God.

Lent helps us identify spiritual areas in which we can grow and sinful areas that we need to avoid. To repent, put simply, means to turn *away* from sin and turn *toward G*od. We use ashes as an outward expression of our need to begin again.

<u>Lent</u>

Lent (which begins on Ash Wednesday) is a time for renewal and preparing for Easter. The children will be discussing the season of Lent and talking about Lenten promises. A good way to remind your child(ren) about these Lenten discussions is to ask them questions about them.

Family Masses

During the year, Whanau will be rostered to participate in Family Masses on Sunday at 10:00 am. These Whanau Masses have been a success in recent years and it is a beautiful way of coming together as a school and Parish whanau to celebrate the Eucharist.
