Tomorrow is a beautiful feast day-the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

"It is a love that cannot be understood. A love that surpasses all knowledge. It surpasses everything. The love of God is so great; a poet described it as a 'bottomless sea without shores...' This is the love that we must try to understand, the love that we receive."

Our Christian beliefs are clear that the love God offers comes without strings. It is unconditional and everlasting and was revealed through his son, Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis went onto say;


"How does God manifest his love? With great works? No: He makes himself smaller and smaller with gestures of tenderness and goodness. He approaches His children and with his closeness He makes us understand the greatness of love."

Pope Francis says we do not need great discourse on love, but men and women "who know how to do these little things for Jesus, for the Father." "Our works of mercy," he said, "are the continuity of this love."

The Pope said that throughout the history of salvation, the Lord has revealed his love to us: "He has been a great teacher."


PTFA NEWS
