Good afternoon Parents, Caregivers and Friends of our School,

As you are aware, we have a Teacher Only Day this Friday. This is an opportunity afforded to us by the Ministry of Education to develop a greater awareness of the Refreshed Curriculum and to break open the changes we can expect to see as we move forward.

We all appreciate that change is inevitable and in many circumstances change is required. The challenging aspect is how we cope with continuous change and to some degree uncertainty. In an election year a lot of promises are made by various political parties and it seems that this is the case in the current time.

As teachers, we want the very best education for your child and in order to do this we need to be continously upskilled. At St Francis Xavier Catholic School we are currently involved in a literacy contract, a numeracy contract, technology (STEAM) and work with consultants around the theme of Wellbeing. In addition to this, teachers in the junior school are being instructed about an approach to reading called the Better Start Literacy Approach.

On Friday, we are going to hear more about further curriculum changes such as the Arts and Science in 2024. This week we have heard that there will be a certain way that we will teach literacy and numeracy and we know that this will involve more professional development. In each subject, learning progressions are going to be reviewed and this will ultimately necessitate a change as to how we will report to parents.

All of this change is interesting and for some of us, mainly the more experienced, it is cyclical. From a personal perspective it is all positive but the most important thing is relationships.

These relationships are rich and varied, relationships with whānau, teachers, staff and our whole school community. Overarching all of this is our relationship with God and God's relationship with us. God delights in our love and we, in turn, are blessed to be his children.

We thank you for supporting our staff and the need for them to be upskilled.

Creation Season:

Pope Francis established 1 September as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, asking the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home. He calls us all to celebrate this opportune moment to "reaffirm [our] personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore God's help for the protection of creation, as well as God's pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live.".

The Season "Celebration" begins 1 September, the Day of Prayer for Creation, and ends 4 October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the Patron Saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations. The theme this year is Let Justice and Peace Flow.
