This Sunday marks the beginning of Advent. Advent is a time of preparation as we await the coming of Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, God is With Us.

<u>Advent</u>

What is Advent? Advent is the Church season just before Christmas. It is considered a time of preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ, a time for conversion, anticipation, hope and thanksgiving. Advent begins on the Sunday nearest November 30th, the feast day of St Andrew the apostle. Since the start date changes yearly, so does the length of the Advent season. This year, Advent begins on Sunday 3rd December. The word Advent means "the coming" in Latin. Advent has been a time of good cheer and spiritual reflection as early as the fourth century. It was originally a time when converts to Christianity readied themselves for baptism. Today, many Christian families have adopted the tradition of lighting the candles on an "Advent Wreath" and using the "Advent Calendar" to count down the days until Christmas. During this time the school will focus on Advent in their classes, where they will reflect on members of Jesus' family.

The Jesse Tree

The Jesse tree helps us connect the custom of decorating our Christmas trees to the events leading to Jesus' birth. The Jesse tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out of the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of King David. We adorn a Jesse tree with illustrated ornaments that represent the people, prophesies, and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. The ornaments of the Jesse tree tell the story of God in the Old Testament, connecting the Advent season with the faithfulness of God across four thousand years of history.



<u>Nativity:</u> Preparations are quietly underway for the Nativity this year. We are blessed to have the Year 1 and 2 teachers' talents to help create a wonderful reminder of the real 'reason for the season' We will be holding our Nativity for parents on <u>Wednesday 6th December</u> at 9:30am in the church.

<u>Year 6 Leavers Mass:</u> Our Year Six leavers Mass (which involves the whole school), will be held on <u>Monday 11th December</u> in the church, at <u>9:00am</u>.

<u>Final School Assembly:</u> Our final school assembly, (Year 6 Prize Giving), will be held on <u>Wednesday 13th December</u> in the church, commencing at <u>9:00am</u>.

Year 3 & 4 Matakohe Trip

This week, as part of the Year 3 & 4 Education Outside the Classroom programme, the children and parent helpers visited Matakohe-Limestone Island. They were able to make connections to their local community, explored the island's environmental sanctuary and learnt about its history. The island was once an important Māori pa site and the remains of kumara cultivation can still clearly be seen on the northern slope of the island. There are also impressive ruins of one of Whangārei's earliest industrial sites - the Limestone Island cement works, founded in 1856. It has been replanted by the community and pests eradicated and is now an important conservation refuge for rare and endangered native animals. Special thanks to the island's ranger, Bevan, and his wife (Department of Conservation), and to those parents/caregivers that helped on the day.
