Some of our staff are undergoing new learning around the new Religious Education Curriculum with our RE Advisor from the Auckland Diocese - Margaret Fitzpatrick. This is an exciting and comprehensive curriculum with new resources. Our Junior school teachers had their professional development in 2023. This year our Year 3-4 school teachers are completing the PD.

This is a developmentally-based early intervention programme designed to strengthen child well-being, promote social-emotional learning, academic competence, and also prevent, reduce, and treat behavioural and emotional problems in young children.



Thank you to our wonderful PTFA who hosted an evening with Lyn Smith last night. Thank you to the parents who came along. Lyn works for the Auckland Catholic Diocese and for Te Kupenga-the National Centre for Religious Studies. She is the co-author of *Wonderfully Made in God's Image*, which supports Catholic schools in their teaching of the sexuality component of the NZ Health curriculum. Lyn also co-authored *Aroha and Diversity* which was published by the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference.

Lyn was able to clarify the church's teaching on some complex issues and gave practical advice on how we can support our tamariki as they journey through life-Te Wa. Please click on the links to these documents, they are excellent reading for all parents and teachers.

## Please Note:

Classrooms do not open until 8:15am therefore we ask that you refrain from dropping your children off before 8am. Children who arrive from 8am are asked to wait on the front courts or in the Te Manawa area.

Although we issue passes for being late and finishing early, it would be preferable if ALL our children are here and finish at the same time so teachers and their classes are not interrupted, and children can learn without disruptions.



Morning classes begin at **8:45 am**. It is essential for your child/children to be at school ready to start their learning day before the bell rings.



Classes end at **2.50pm**. Children should be collected by **3.15pm** unless they are with their parents, attending the After School Care programme or attending sports practice.
